The following changes apply to the 2006 printing and have been incorporated into the 2009 reprint.

Last Update: 2/26/2009

Page 9 – Paragraph 2, sentence 3 – Change 2003 to 2006.

Page 110 – Paragraph 4, sentence 3 – Correct indented boldface formula to read: $A = W/V = 120/120 = 1$.

Page 114 – Last paragraph – Correct to read: Ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) protection is required for all receptacles in the bathroom, and all receptacles servicing countertop surfaces in the kitchen.

Page 119 – Paragraph 2, sentence 1 – Correct to read: The code requirements for kitchen and bath receptacles can be a problem to deal with, particularly for receptacles mounted above countertops.

Page 120 – Fig. 9.9, sentence 1 – Correct to read: Codes require ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) protection for all bathroom receptacles, and all kitchen receptacles servicing countertop surfaces, to protect against electrocution.

Page 131 – Paragraph 1, sentence 1 – Correct to read: Ever since Thomas Edison improved the incandescent light bulb...
